

Pierre n'est pas ici ; il **aura oublié** = Pierre isn't here; he must have forgotten
 Luc est heureux ; il **aura gagné** = Luc is happy; he must have won

The futur antérieur can make simple assumptions regarding past events, where the English verb "must" would be used in conjunction with the futur antérieur

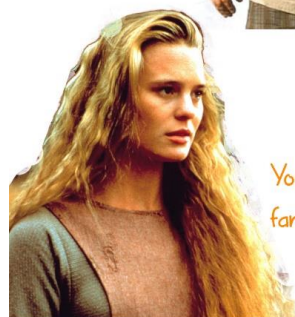
I will have prepared to fight



I will have wanted a peanut.



As you will have wished



You will have passed me that pitcher, farm boy

J'aurai mangé à midi = I will have eaten at/by noon.
 Quand tu arriveras, il l'aura déjà fait = When you arrive, he will already have done it.
 Elle lui aura parlé demain = She will have talked to him (by) tomorrow.
 Dans un mois, nous serons partis = In a month, we will have left

It describes an action that will have happened or will be finished by a specific point in the future.

I will have married the wrong man

How do I make it?

The French future perfect is a compound conjugation, which means it has two parts: -----**Just like the Passé Composé, you need to know which AUXILIARY verb, the verb takes**

- 1) future of the auxiliary verb (either avoir or être)
- 2) past participle of the main verb

Which ones take ÊTRE?

Vandertramp verbs, and Reflexive verbs

Devenir (to become) = devenu
 Revenir (to come back) = revenu
 Monter (to go up) = monté
 Rester (to stay) = resté
 Sortir (to go out) = sorti
 Venir (to come) = venu
 Aller (to go) = allé
 Naître (to be born) = né
 Descendre (to go down) = descendu
 Entrer (to enter) = entré
 Rentrer (to re-enter) = rentré
 Tomber (to fall) = tombé
 Retourner (to return) = retourné
 Arriver (to arrive) = arrivé
 Mourir (to die) = mort
 Partir (to leave) = parti

Step 1: Conjugate the future simple in either avoir or être (depending on which verb the main verb takes)

Step 2: Write the main verb in the passé composé, and only use the past participle (the main verb) of the passé composé

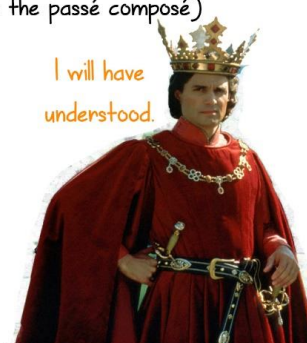
This is what it looks like:

This is the future simple of 'avoir' J'aurai aimé
 this is the past participle of 'aimer' (what 'aimer' looks like in the passé composé)

Here are some examples:

Regular Verbs	Irregular Verbs	Vandertramp Verbs	Reflexive Verbs
J'aurai aimé	J'aurai vu	Je serai allé(e)	Je me serai lavé(e)
Tu auras aimé	Tu auras vu	Tu seras allé(e)	Tu te seras lavé(e)
Il aura aimé	Il aura vu	Il sera allé	Il se sera lavé
Elle aura aimé	Elle aura vu	Elle sera allée	Elle se sera lavée
Nous aurons aimé	Nous aurons vu	Nous serons allé(e)s	Nous nous serons lavé(e)s
Vous aurez aimé	Vous aurez vu	Vous serez allé(e)s	Vous vous serez lavé(e)s
Ils auront aimé	Ils auront vu	Ils seront allés	Ils se seront lavés
Elles auront aimé	Elles auront vu	Elles seront allées	Elles se seront lavées
