## Doberman Pinscher vs. Miniature Pinscher

35% of Canadian homes own a dog. \_\_\_\_\_ you are considering getting a dog, consider these two options: the Doberman, and the Miniature Pinscher (min pin).

Many people think that Min Pins were developed by breeding Dobermans to progressively smaller sizes, and indeed, they look similar to Dobermans. However, the Min Pin is a distinct and much older breed. \_\_\_\_\_ you knew about their lineage, it would be easy to assume that a Min Pin, was just a Doberman relative, or Doberman puppy.



Min pins need a lot of exercise, so you have time to spend outdoors with a dog, the Min Pin might not be for you. However, they adapt well to living in an apartment, even if you don't have a backyard, as long as you can walk the Min Pin, then they should be able to get enough exercise. Interestingly, Min Pins do not tolerate cold weather you live somewhere very cold for several months of the year, this breed might struggle to get exercise indoors, during winter months. The Min Pin weighs around 8-II pounds you require a smaller dog, the Min Pin is an excellent choice.
The Doberman is a different breed. While the Doberman descends from Rottweilers, Min Pins descended from Greyhounds and Dachshunds.
